The FY 2015 Information Security Awareness (ISA) course and assessment is due soon. Users have until March 31, 2015, to complete the training. A pretest is available for this course. If the user passes the pretest, they do not need to take the course. There is no extension for the March 31, 2015 deadline to complete the training.

Make sure your ACOs take training. If you miss the deadline, ACOs will be blocked from PCIT.

Carl – how is reaccreditation coming along? Are people still having a hard time getting in? Marcus said it could be settings on individual computers. PCIT developers working with Aglearn to make systems compatible, but if it is a computer setting issue, there's not much that we can do.

People who are due in the next month or two have been giving an extension. If anyone needs an extension, let ES know.

3. Chilean Import Requirements for Seed for Planting

SAG Chile has revised phytosanitary import requirements for seed (for planting) from all origins. New requirements include laboratory testing, field inspection and treatments for certain botanical species. PIM has secured additional options for satisfying the requirements which will be captured in PExD commodity summaries. Maggie reiterated that mother plants need field inspection and lab testing. PIM has

	negotiated other options. PExD has been updated. AD option expires at the end of this year. Start working on field inspection and lab testing of mother plants. Spread the word to exporters so they can be in compliance.	
4.	ISPM 15 Regulation of wood packaging material in international trade Phytosanitary Issues Management has concerns with ISPM 15 non-compliance for US exports and would like to discuss with Export Services a method to decrease non-compliance of wood packaging materials associated with US exports. PIM staff has concerns on the volume of FNNC's we get for ISPM15 violations for	Maggie
	export. We can't do much for non-agriculture commodities, but we need to determine what we can do to help this issue. Ingrid- would like to decrease noncompliant WPM that comes into the US so	
	conversely we would like to decrease those going out. Susan mentioned she's done a lot of outreach. Maybe it's time to go back to those people we've reached before to remind them.	
	Susan mentioned that she's heard of CBP ports that will give warnings for the first 5 violations and gives violation notices on the 6 th strike. Ingrid will ask QPAS about it. There is nothing in the standard about giving chances.	
	Ingrid asked what we did for exports. What happens when a commodity is presented for inspection and it's not on ISPM 15-compliant pallets?	
	All we can do is advise the exporter that using noncompliant WPM could cause rejection or delays. We still issue the PC.	
	Mike Perry suggested reaching out to brokers, freight forwarders, shippers, etc.	
	Maggie reported that companies (Brazil) are aware but it is cheaper to treat non-compliant pallets in a foreign country than to purchase the correct pallets here.	
	Laney - if pallets are "cargo", they need PCs. If a country sends us pallets, a PC is issued saying the wood is compliant but the pallets themselves may not be marked with the ISPM15 stamp. The PC is the certification.	
5.	Ineligible Commodity List- Revision by Export Services	Maggie Smither
	 The Commodities Ineligible for Certification list is not all inclusive, nor is it intended to perform the exhaustive task of containing all commodities which are considered ineligible for an export certificate. Rather, this list simply addresses the most common queries Export Services has received over the years in determining commodity eligibility. Guidance is provided in the Export Program Manual (XPM). If the product is not listed here and ACOs have questions concerning commodity eligibility, contact 	

Export Services.

Items on the ineligible commodity list which have traditionally been ineligible for
export certification are now eligible. The current list will be revised by Export Services
in order to display current eligibility of commodities for export certification. After
revision, the new Ineligible Commodity List will be shared with ECW.

The published list has been distributed with agenda. They're extremely processed, mixed with oil or other. Please take a look and provide feedback.

6. Official Sampling Method for Seed

Mike Bryan

Is it a possibility to officially sample ears of corn for laboratory analysis? The ability to
officially collect seed (ears of seed) prior to harvesting all the seed would allow more
time for laboratory analysis to be conducted and completed. If sample collection &
testing is initiated after harvest the exporter doesn't have adequate time to ship the
material.

Big companies want to harvest, pack, and ship. Could they pick a composite representing all the lines in the field and do a lab analysis? What if one line was found positive, would the whole lot be rejected?

Currently, they harvest the lines, dry the seed and the seed sits in large envelopes. They're sampled and sent to the lab. The company needs to wait for all the individual lab tests to come back before they can ship.

Firm (seed company) needs to know the risk of having the whole lot rejected.

Mike Perry said we would get back to the ECW on this issue.

If there are inconsistency issues with export certification across the US, the following should be reported to Export Services:

- Commodity and Type
- Certification Type
- o Duty Station
- Destination country
- Explanation of specific event or issue
- Date of occurrence(s)
- Explanation provided to applicant from authorized certifying official (ACO) or other official.

ES continues to try and track inconsistencies. If you hear of anything, please let ES know. Providing as much detail as possible would be helpful.

Mike mentioned they hear a lot of complaints about the inconsistencies in charging fees. Not much we can do about it. Example is trying to resolve a consistency issue within MI about how things are done in the Upper Pen as compared to the Lower Pen.

Susan mentioned that individual states accept a particular Russian document as an IP where other states will not. Mike Perry mentioned official communications is always going to be an issue.
