#### Robert H. Deibel Greenhouses, Crestwood, KY

Arrive: 8:15 AM

Depart: 9:00 AM

Deibel Greenhouses was founded in 1924. Bobby Diebel is a fourth generation partner with his uncle, Dennis Deibel. In 2016, they sold over 100,000 hemp clones to Kentucky hemp program participants, and are planning for a similar number in 2017. They also grow several thousand plants for indoor production in their own greenhouses.



#### Mason Lane Farms, Goshen, KY

The 2,000-acre Mason Lane Farm is owned by Eleanor Bingham Miller. The property is used for agriculture, recreation, wildlife habitat, and conservation. They have been approved to grow more than 60 acres of hemp in 2017, and are working with three different processors to grow the crop for grain, fiber, and cannabidiol (CBD).



#### Victory Hemp Foods, Louisville, KY

Victory Hemp Foods is currently processing and selling Kentucky-grown hemp grain to bulk customers and retail customers through regional grocers. The pilot line makes hemp oil, de-hulled hemp hearts, and hemp protein powder. Owner Chad Rosen was drawn to Kentucky by the strong support for hemp legislation.



#### Sunstrand, Louisville, KY

Sunstrand is dedicated to furthering the usage of sustainable materials. CEO Trey Riddle notes that they are the preeminent supplier of biomaterials for a variety of industrial applications, but with an emphasis on polymer composites. Sunstrand is presently the only commercial industrial processor of technical-grade bast fiber in North America. Besides hemp, other fibers include bamboo, flax and kenaf.
